DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Tragic heroes are often defined as great or virtuous characters destined for downfall, suffering, or defeat, but that could just be a matter of fate. To be a true tragedy, the hero must be responsible for the events that bring about his demise.

Macbeth, when we first meet him, is an honored war hero who has earned the respect and love of all. He has championed his country, his king rewards him generously, his wife loves him, and those who have served with him sing his praise. Life is good and situated to get better, but is that enough? The witches plant the seed of ambition and Lady Macbeth nurtures it, but ultimately it is Macbeth's choice to act. He can



have it all if he will go against his better nature this one time — to kill the king. But once diverted, nature changes. His world, formerly rooted in decency, has been poisoned with lying and killing. The restful sleep of a good conscience no longer comes. Regardless of credibility, plots against him are found at every junction. The formerly noble nature of Macbeth turns foul, rotting from the foundation. The hero becomes the tyrant.

Either ethical concerns, an understanding of the social contract, our ideas of self-image, or our basic humanity keep us from taking a variety of paths. But what happens when, for whatever reasons, we go against our better nature? A single choice, however trivial, can take us down a dangerous route from virtue to degeneracy. The potential for a tragic hero is within each of us. Choose wisely.





MARC SINGER

Veteran of stage, film and television, recipient of the LA Drama Critics Circle award for his portrayal of Petruchio in *The Taming of the Shrew*, Mr. Singer originated the title role in the iconic film *The Beastmaster* and its sequels; directed and costarred in its subsequent series; and played lead in the popular sci-fi TV series *V: The Final Battle*. Over a hundred hours of film and TV include a season on *Dallas* and a continuing role on *The Young and the Restless* – for which series he also contributed as a writer. Early in his career, Mr. Singer was fortunate to co-star with some of the profession's historic greats – Henry Fonda, Burt Lancaster, Olivia de Haviland, Henry Wilcoxon, Roddy McDowell, Geraldine Page, Maureen



O'Sullivan, Jack Warden, Leslie Neilson, to name a few, and recommends IMDB on the web for further references. His stage credits include Shylock, Antonio, and Bassanio in three separate productions of *The Merchant of Venice*, King Lear in the play of the same title, Demetrius in *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, Proteus in *Two Gentlemen of Verona*, Rosencrantz in *Rozencrantz and Guildenstern are Dead*, and plays ranging from Chekov to Pinter. Author and originator of *The System: How to Act Shakespeare*®, this past season in L.A., he headed the Group Repertory Theater's Shakespeare workshop, and both directed and played Oberon in *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. His most recent TV work includes four episodes each on the sci-fi series *Beauty and the Beast* and *Arrow*, as well as guesting on Ru Paul's new series *A.J. and the Queen*. Mr. Singer's original play *Gary's Place* will premier in 2019, in which he will essay the title role.

PATRICK MONTGOMERY -





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


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Sonnet 116: Let me not to the marriage of true minds

A NOTE ABOUT OUR WITCHES...

The witches that you will meet tonight are not the pointy-hatted, Halloween witches you may be accustomed to. Rather, they are a reference to the mysticism, mythology, and warlike nature of early Pictish tribal culture. The Picts are from times already ancient to MacBeth's world, being present in Scotland many hundreds of years before the Celts arrived. Roman historians gave them the name "Picti" which meant "The Painted Ones", suggesting painted or tattooed bodies. Many of today's popular tattoo designs have their roots in Pictish Symbol Stones. The women in particular were known for their robust physical presence, brave and strong in battle, painting themselves for war and fighting fiercely alongside the men. Writings of Ptolemy Soter, a general of Alexander the Great, include an episode where he met such female warriors. He asked them what they feared. Chillingly, they replied, "Nothing."

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
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
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
